FSST 09/23 APOLOGIES FOR ABSENCE

Apologies were received from Cllrs Councillors Mat Brown, Michaela Martin, Kika Mirylees and John Ward

FSST 10/23 DISCLOSURE OF INTERESTS

Cllr Beaman declared he was a Director of Creative Response.

In view of the project being co-ordinated by Farnham Town Council for the Lantern Festival, the Town Clerk had approved a dispensation in order that the Trustee could consider the application and make a decision.

FSST 11/23 Minutes of last meeting

The minutes of the meeting held on 25 May 2023 were agreed as a correct record.

FSST 12/23 Financial Position

The Trustee noted that the Trust normally allocates interest and preserves the capital fund. In general, this means approximately £25k has been available in recent years. The latest valuation (March 2023 was £907,762.

In 2023/24 the Trust allocated £19,175 in grants and interest/dividends of just under £31,412 was earned noting these were provisional figures and were subject to end of year adjustments once the final certificates had been received.

In the previous year (2022/23) interest of £31,436 was received with grants of £23,803 allocated. It was hoped that in 2024-25 improved dividends might be available based on the current market situation.

The Trustee noted the successful outcome of the First World Craft Town Residency with Fiona Bryne coming to Farnham and the gift of a commissioned piece of work which is on display in the Craft Study Centre. This was the first of five pieces that would be collected as a memento of the residencies with the Trustee having agreed to allocate an annual contribution to Farnham World Craft Town to support residencies and exchanges between the World Craft Town partners and other activity to encourage the growth of Farnham as a World Craft Town.

Although a suggested annual contribution of £10,000 was agreed for an initial period of 5 years, the first year contribution was £5,000 and this was paid to Farnham Town Council. The second year promotion of the residency opportunity would commence shortly.

The name of the charity is the Farnham School of Science and Art and it is also known as the Farnham South Street Trust.

Structure, governance and management

The trust was originally formed in 1880 by the gift of a property to trustees as an art school. With the later sale of the property the proceeds have been invested with the income being applied in promoting the education in art and allied subjects of persons residing or studying in Farnham.

The Trustee reviews the investment of the charity's assets on a regular basis.

The governing document is The Charity Commission Scheme dated 10th March 1980 which was amended by The Charity Commission Scheme dated 19th June 1998.

As noted above Farnham Town Council is the trustee of the charity and members of the Council sit ex-officio when the Council meets as trustee.

Objective and activities

The objective of the charity is to apply the income of the charity in promoting in such ways as it thinks fit, the education in art and allied subjects of persons residing or studying in Farnham in the County of Surrey. In furtherance of this objective, the charity makes grants to schools and other organisations in the Farnham area to enable those organisations to organise educational workshops and projects covering art and associated subjects for the benefit of children and adults living or studying in the local area.

TRUSTEE'S REPORT FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2024

Farnham Town Council meets annually as trustee to consider applications for grants for purposes which fall within the objective of the charity.

In setting and carrying out the objective of the charity the trustee has had regard to the guidance issued by the Charity Commission on public benefit.

Financial review

The charity's funds are currently invested with Blackrock Investment Management (UK) Limited. Funds are divided between two charity authorised investment funds specifically designed to meet the investment needs of charities. BlackRock Charities UK Bond Fund aims to provide a high level of income from fixed interest securities. BlackRock Charities UK Equity Fund aims to provide medium to long term capital and income appreciation by investing mainly in UK listed companies.

The income received by the charity from its investments during the year ended 31^{st} March 2024 totalled £32,347 and as noted above it made grants amounting to £24,175, in relation to grant applications for the 2023/24 year.

The value of the charity's investments rose from £907,762 as at 31st March 2023 to £930,582 as at 31st March 2024.

Future plans

The trustee intends that the charity will continue providing grants in a similar way to the recent past in accordance with its objective, although it will monitor its investment carefully to ensure that the endowment is not depleted.

NOTES TO THE ACCOUNTS FOR THE YEAR ENDED 31ST MARCH 2024

I. ACCOUNTING POLICIES

I.I Basis of Preparation

The financial statements are prepared under the historical cost convention with the exception that investments are included at market value.

The accounts have been prepared in accordance with the Statement of Recommended Practice: "Accounting and Reporting by Charities" (FRS 102) and applicable accounting standards, and the Charities Act 2011.

1.2 Accumulated funds

The charity has a single permanent endowment fund the capital of which is invested by the trustee in perpetuity. The trustee may apply the income to the general purposes of the trust in furtherance of the charitable objectives.

The unrestricted funds held by the Trust are funds that can be used in accordance with the charitable objectives at the discretion of the Trustee.

1.3 Investments

Investment income is included in the accounts when receivable.

Investment gains and losses include any gain or loss on the sale of investments and any gain or loss resulting from revaluing investments to market value at the end of the year.

Investments are represented by common investment funds and are valued at bid price at the year end.

2 GRANTS

Grants are made to local institutions for the purpose of promoting the education in art and allied subjects of persons residing in Farnham in the county of Surrey

3 FIXED ASSET INVESTMENTS

The charity's investment assets are represented by holdings in BlackRock Charities UK Equity and Bond Funds. Both these funds are registered in the United Kingdom.

4 TRUSTEE

The individual councillors acting as trustee received no remuneration or expenses from the charity during the year.

5 CHARITY STATUS

Farnham School of Science and Art is a Charitable Trust for tax purposes.



South Street Trust report. October 2024 Feedback from Beneficiaries 2023-24



The South Street Trust awarded £20,375 towards 16 arts-based educational projects in 2023/24. Recipients included a number of local schools, Farnham Maltings, The New Ashgate Gallery, Creative Response and Phylis Tuckwell Hospice.

Below provides an overview of some of the projects funded by the South Street Trust in 2023/24 and their outcomes:

Farnham Heath End School received funding of £500 to run a sculpture workshop for Year 9 students which was very well received. Students were encouraged to explore structure, surface and found materials, working out of their comfort zones to create experimental sculptures.

The New Ashgate Gallery received £2,000 for their The World of Weaving and Fabrics project. The funding enabled them to offer four family craft activity days/half days with a high-quality maker, free to all Farnham families, and to be offered as part of local community events such as Music in the Meadow. Approximately 278 participants took part in the activities and feedback was overwhelmingly positive. 95% of participants said they learnt new skills whilst 93% highlighted the importance of having access to free community crafts.

Farnham Maltings received £1,600 towards their first Family Festival offering free visual art participatory activities and workshops that focused on developing creative skills for young people and their families. The event was very well attended and young people enjoyed a wide range of activities from pottery to pyrography.

The University of the Creative Arts received £2,425 to run 'Kindness Rocks', the primary objective of which was to foster awareness about both uniqueness and kindness. They delivered workshops across 4 local schools, the Malting and UCA, engaging with over 500 participants resulting in around 400 decorated rocks and pebbles which were showcased at the UCA. Furthermore, the workshops actively engaged and provided work experience opportunities to both national and international students from the UCA, equipping eight students with essential skills for their professional development within the visual arts realm.
